About birdshot

Birdshot chorioretinopathy, also called birdshot uveitis, is a rare, autoimmune, chronic, potentially sight-threatening form of posterior uveitis.

'Posterior' means it affects the back of the eye. 'Uveitis' means inflammation of the uvea: the part of the eye that is made up of the iris, the choroid layer and the ciliary body.

Birdshot is a relatively new eye condition, first described in 1949.

BUS aims to:

- Support people diagnosed with birdshot
- Provide clear information for patients and professionals
- Improve services for people with birdshot
- Enable research to be undertaken
- Raise awareness to improve early diagnosis and appropriate treatment
